


Partnership with the Presbyterian Church of South Sudan

In South Sudan we partner with the **Presbyterian Church of South Sudan**. Since December 2013 the nation has been engulfed in a civil war involving the two major tribes — the Dinkas and the Nuer. This has produced large-scale destruction and loss of life.


Over one million people have been displaced inside South Sudan and more than 400,000 people have fled to neighbouring countries such as Ethiopia, Kenya, Sudan, and Uganda.

APWM missionary Motor Yat, an Australian citizen of South Sudanese birth, serves the Presbyterian Church of South Sudan congregations in the refugee camps in western Ethiopia. These camps house 388,000 people - mostly from the Nuer tribe. Many of the Presbyterians fled South Sudan with only the clothes on their back. They now have no income and the one thing they ask for is Bibles.
